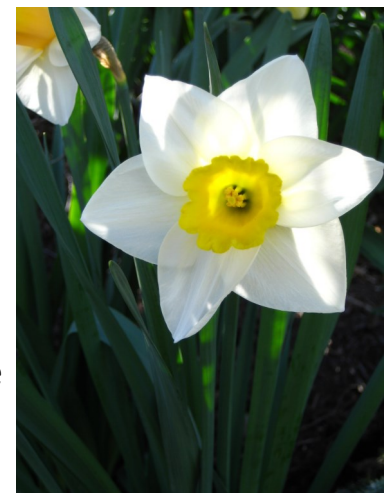


Why? Because we have seen in Christ in his humility and death exalted in the resurrection and now sitting at the right hand of the Father.
